We have an exciting opportunity to further expand our Te Kakano clinics in Southern and are now seeking Registered Nurses passionate about delivering clinics to improve Māori health outcomes.

About the Role - Mō te tūnga

The Registered Nurse is responsible for establishing a therapeutic partnership with whānau through clinical assessment, intervention, care planning and education in the community clinic setting; and providing community outreach nursing. Working in conjunction with the Nurse Practitioner, you will promote Māori models of care that value health and social service collaboration and address the individual needs of whānau.

About you – He kōrero mōu

The ideal candidate will have the following:

- Registered Nurse with current NCNZ practicing certificate, preferably with vaccinator and cervical screening qualifications
- A desire to engage in the pathway to become a Nurse Practitioner
- Strong links and experience with Southern Māori communities and able to connect through whakawhanaungatanga
- Tikanga Māori and Te Reo Māori skills
- Able to demonstrate a high level of personal integrity
- Full NZ drivers license

This is a 37.5 hour/week role based in Otago. You will be supported with clinical supervision and training and development opportunities to support your journey to Nurse Practitioner. A mobile phone, laptop, and access to a fleet vehicle are included.
